Walgreens is taking a unique approach to solving the <u>pharmacist shortage</u>: creating the Walgreens Deans Advisory Council to boost the number of students enrolling in pharmacy schools and execute on other goals plaguing the industry, any executives and deans from 17 pharmacy schools and will meet quarterly to discuss attraction and retention strategies,

according to Walgreens. The first meeting is slated for early March.

Rick Gates, SVP and chief pharmacy officer at Walgreens, told Healthcare Brew that the council—which includes deans from around the US to make sure there is a "range of views and opinions"—plans to publicly disclose the goals it sets during meetings and give periodic updates on progress made.
